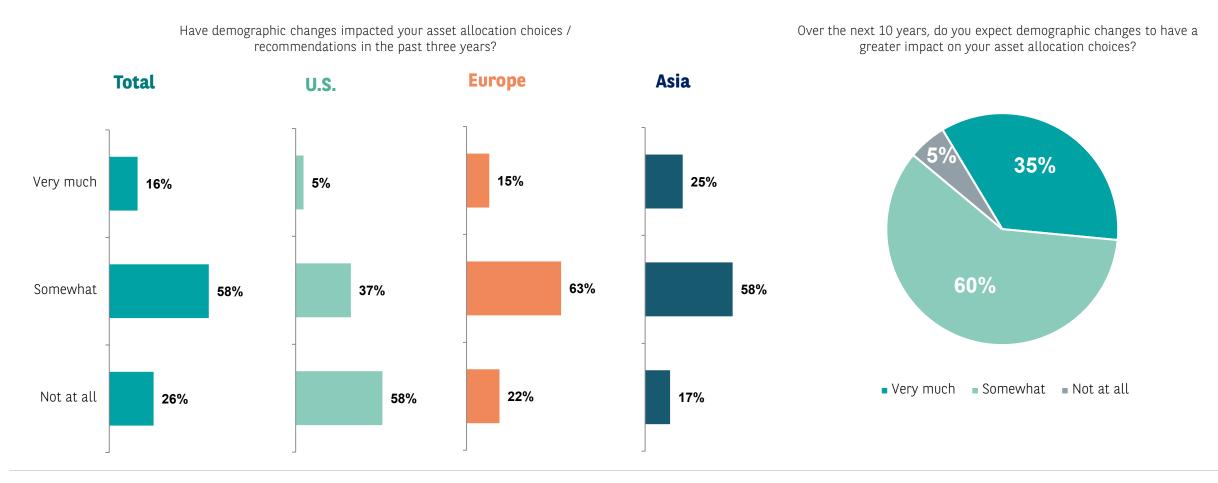
IMPACT OF DEMOGRAPHIC CHANGE ON INVESTMENT STRATEGIES AND ASSET ALLOCATION CHOICES

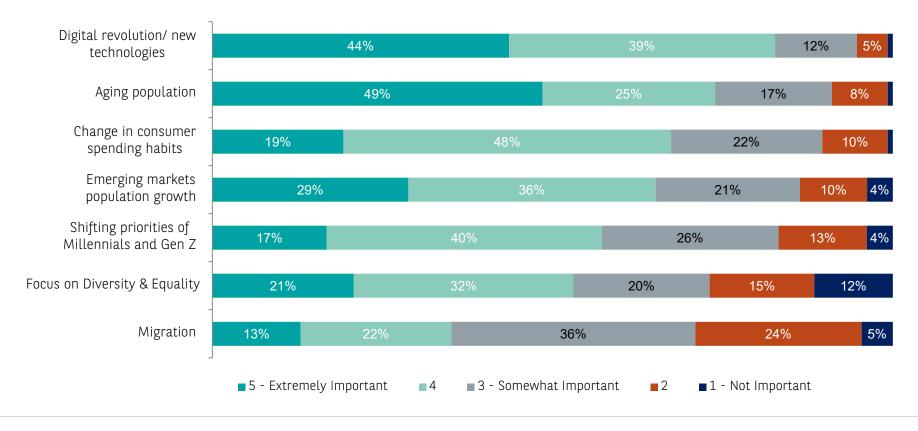
The sustainable investor for a changing world

Three quarters of respondents said demographic changes had impacted asset allocation choices / recommendations in the past three years, highest in Asia and lowest in the U.S; looking forward, 95% of investors believe demographic changes will impact asset allocation over the next 10 years.



New technologies and aging populations are cited as the most important aspects of demographic and societal change related to investment strategy; there is also a notable focus on Diversity and Equality in the U.S. and a focus on the impact of Emerging Market Population Growth in Asia.

How important are the following aspects of demographic and societal change related to your organizations' or your clients' investment strategy?

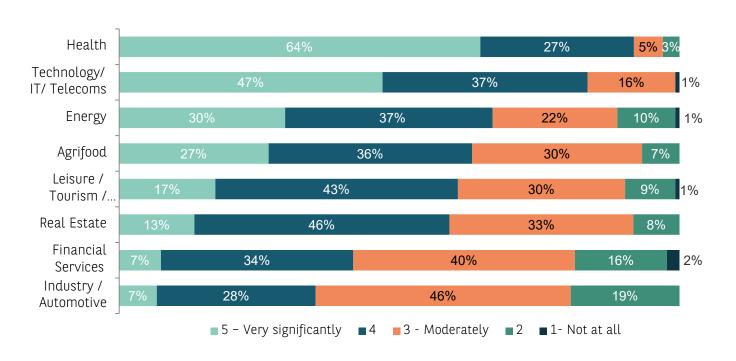


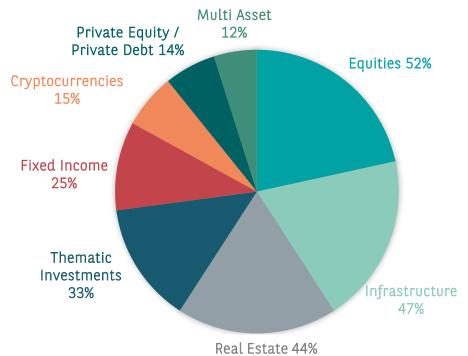


Healthcare and technology are viewed as the sectors most likely to benefit from these changes, with healthcare viewed as the single most important investment theme for plan members and clients, by a wide margin; equities, infrastructure and real estate are seen as the asset classes that are most likely to benefit.

Which asset classes do you think are most likely to benefit from demographic change and why do you think that?

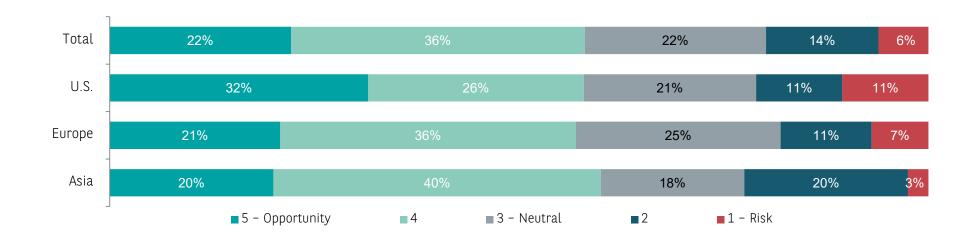






Demographic change is viewed as an investment opportunity by almost 60% of investors, but is viewed as an investment risk by 20% of investors, and hence **there is a mix of preferences for taking on increased and decreased investment risk in the future.**

About the survey

The survey was conducted by Coalition Greenwich on behalf of BNPP AM during May 2022. It canvassed the opinions of 135 institutional and intermediary investors in Europe, Asia and the US regarding the impact of demographic change on investment decision-making and asset allocation. The survey was the latest in a series of surveys conducted as part of BNPP AM's research partnership with Coalition Greenwich.
